June 2, 2024 – 2nd Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Gospel: Mark 2:23—3:6 Jesus challenges the prevailing interpretation of what is lawful on the sabbath and tells his critics that the sabbath was made for humankind, not the other way around. Healing the man with the withered hand is work that cannot wait until the next day.

June 9, 2024 – 3rd Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 3:20-35 In response to charges that he is possessed, Jesus wonders aloud how anyone who is demon-possessed can cast out demons. Those who do the will of God are possessed by the Holy Spirit, siblings of Christ.

June 16, 2024 – 4th Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 4:26-34 Jesus frequently uses parables to teach ordinary people as they are able to hear and understand. Images of sowing and growing show the vitality of God's kingdom.

June 23, 2024 – 5th Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 4:35-41 Jesus' calming of the storm on the sea reveals his power over evil, since the sea represents evil and chaos. The boat on the sea is a symbol of the church and invites us to trust God amid life's turbulence.

June 30, 2024 – 6th Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 5:21-43 Jairus, a respected leader, begs Jesus to heal his daughter. A woman with a hemorrhage was considered ritually unclean and treated as an outcast. Both Jairus and the unnamed woman come to Jesus in faith, believing in his power to heal and bring life out of death.

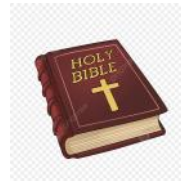

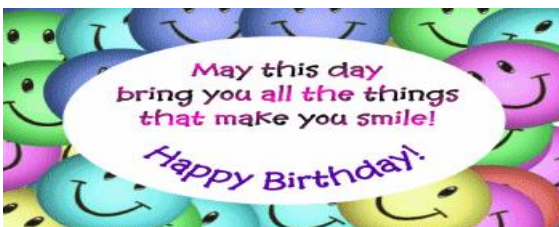

The following devotion was used to open the Church Council Meeting in May, was submitted by
Linda Bewley....

MISSION AND VISION

Acts 1:1-8

Early in my ministry I was deeply influenced by the KJV of Proverbs 28:19. “Where there is no vision, the people perish.” If a group of people don’t know what they are doing and why they are doing it, they will lose focus, fall apart, sink into mediocrity or, worse, cease to exist.

When General Electric stopped focusing on its main business of electricity and diversified into all sorts of unrelated businesses, it eventually sank into a malaise that nearly killed that huge company. If a platoon of soldiers in Afghanistan doesn’t know what came to attack and doesn’t understand how their mission fits into their government’s overall vision for that worn-torn country, they will not be focused and will be vulnerable. When a local church doesn’t have a clear mission and vision of God’s desired future for them, it can lose its missional focus.

That’s why Jesus’ last words to the infant church before his ascension were words about mission and vision. His disciples knew that he had come to bring the Kingdom of God to this world (Mark 1:14-15). Now that he had completed his work by conquering death, they wanted to know when and how that kingdom would come.

While admonishing them not to think about times and dates, Jesus gave them their mission; “you will be my witnesses.” By doing that, you “will make disciples” and, thus, promote the kingdom of God on this earth. Here’s the vision that will drive all your work. Though you will start right where you are in Jerusalem, you will carry my name “to the ends of the earth.” By the power of the Spirit that mission and vision have driven the church for over 2000 years.

As the Spirit leads, Jesus clarifies that mission for particular people with specific visions. For example, he gave Peter a vision to go to the centurion Cornelius (Acts 10). In a healthy church, people have a clear sense of their church’s specific mission and a compelling vision for its future. Healthy churches periodically assess all areas of ministry based on their mission, vision and goals. And they feel so strongly about their mission and vision that they are willing to change and even suffer for the gospel.

Prayer: Spirit of God, fall fresh on us. “We ask no dream, no prophet ecstasies, no sudden rending of the veil of clay, no angel visitant, no opening skies; but take the dimness of our souls away.” Amen

Discussion Starters: How does the life of your church reflect a clear mission and vision? How many of our people (or us) can state that mission and vision?

Something to Try: Ask the Holy Spirit for leading on how to more effectively live out your mission and vision. Or ask if your church needs a new mission and vision.

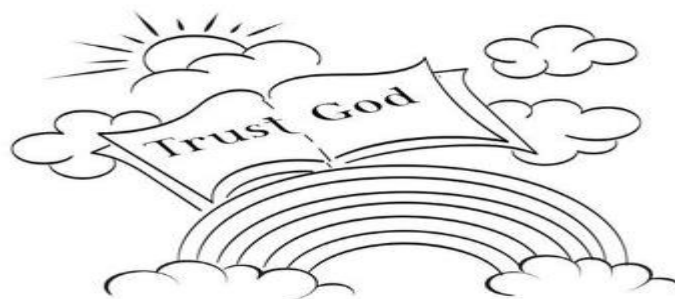

SIMPLY GIVING

Save time, simplify your life, and support your church! We're keeping up with the times by offering our parishioners another way to help our ministry. Our Electronic Giving Program called Simply Giving is an automated program that will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash! And, this method of giving also saves our "counting team" time and trouble every week to open envelopes.

Here is how it works:

You authorize a specified amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the Church account. You also specify the frequency of the transfer.

It is fast, safe and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost or stolen, or destroyed. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTHING and you save the cost of the check. The Church will issue you a donation statement for your tax records, and your bank statements will provide you with a record of transfer as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be made to our General Fund, Benevolence, and/or World Hunger and/or Building Maintenance.

Many members/families of Trinity are currently using Simply Giving.

You can change your amount or frequency with two weeks notice. And, of course, you can cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by notifying the church office. But we believe that once you have enjoyed the convenience and savings of this new program, you won't want to go back to the old way of contributing to our church!

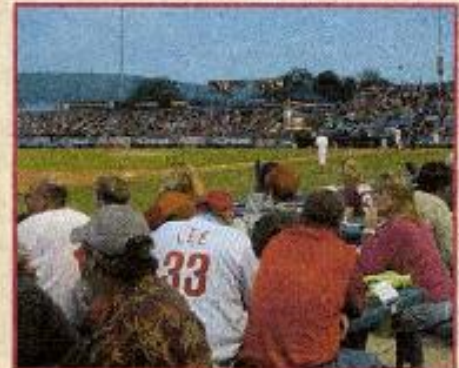
