July 7, 2024–7th Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 6:1-13 At home and abroad, Jesus and his disciples encounter resistance as they seek to proclaim God's word and relieve affliction.

July 14, 2024 – 8th Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 6:14-29 As Jesus and his disciples begin to attract attention, Mark recalls the story of John the Baptist's martyrdom. Like John, Jesus and his disciples will also suffer at the hands of those opposed to the gospel of salvation.

July 21, 2024–9th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon Text: Mark 6:30-34, 53-56 When Jesus sends his disciples out to teach and heal, they minister among large numbers of people. Their work is motivated by Christ's desire to be among those in need.

July 28, 2024 – 10th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon Text: John 6:1-21 In John's gospel, the miracles of Jesus are called "signs," because they reveal the true character of God. As such, they remain within the mystery of God and cannot be brought under human control.

August 4, 2024 – 11th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon Text: John 6:24-35 Many of the five thousand people Jesus fed in the wilderness continued to follow him throughout the countryside. Jesus challenges them to consider the real nature of their quest.

August 11, 2024 – 12th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon Text: John 6:35, 41-51 After feeding more than five thousand people in the wilderness, Jesus teaches them regarding the true significance of this remarkable sign.

August 18, 2024 – 13th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon text: John 6:51-58 In John's gospel, the feeding of the five thousand leads to extended teaching in which Jesus identifies himself as the true "bread of life." Finally, in these verses, he makes a connection that would not be understood until after his death, in light of the church's celebration of holy communion.

August 25, 2024 – 14th Sunday After Pentecost

Sermon Text: John 6:56-69 The "hard saying" that offends Jesus' disciples is his claim that his followers must eat his flesh and drink his blood. The followers who return to their old lives know something about how odd this sounds. Simon Peter, on the other hand, knows something about the scarcity of living, gracious words. He asks the most important question: "To whom shall we go?"

The following devotion was used to open the Church Council Meeting in June, was submitted by Kurt Yescavage....

SURRENDERING TO GOD

Genesis 22:14

"So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide."

Born on a farm, Judson Van DeVenter learned to paint, studied art, and became an art teacher. God, however, had a different plan for him. Friends valued his word in church and urged him to go into evangelism. Judson felt God calling him too, but it was hard for him to give up his love for teaching art. He wrestled with God, but "at last", he wrote, "the pivotal hour of my life came, and I surrendered all."

We can't imagine Abraham's heartbreak when God called him to surrender his son Isaac. In the wake of God's command to "sacrifice him there as a burnt offering" (Genesis 22:2), we ask ourselves what precious thing God is calling us to sacrifice. We know that he ultimately spared Isaac (v.12) and yet the point is made:


Abraham was willing to surrender what was most precious to him. He trusted God to provide in the midst of a most difficult calling.

We say we love God, but are we willing to sacrifice what's dearest to us? Judson Van DeVenter followed God's call into evangelism and later penned the beloved hymn "I Surrender All." In time, God called Judson back into teaching. One of his students was a young man named Billy Graham.

God's plan for our lives has purposes we can't imagine. He longs for us to be willing to surrender what is dearest. It seems that's the least we can do. After all, He sacrificed for us His only begotten Son.

What's God calling for you? What might you need to sacrifice for Him?

Dear God, I struggle to fully surrender parts of my life to You. Please help me to trust You. Amen

SIMPLY GIVING

Save time, simplify your life, and support your church! We're keeping up with the times by offering our parishioners another way to help our ministry. Our Electronic Giving Program called Simply Giving is an automated program that will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash! And, this method of giving also saves our "counting team" time and trouble every week to open envelopes.

Here is how it works:

You authorize a specified amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the Church account. You also specify the frequency of the transfer.

It is fast, safe and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost or stolen, or destroyed. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTHING and you save the cost of the check. The Church will issue you a donation statement for your tax records, and your bank statements will provide you with a record of transfer as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be made to our General Fund, Benevolence, and/or World Hunger and/or Building Maintenance.

Many members/families of Trinity are currently using Simply Giving.

You can change your amount or frequency with two weeks notice. And, of course, you can cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by notifying the church office. But we believe that once you have enjoyed the convenience and savings of this new program, you won't want to go back to the old way of contributing to our church!
